


## The Norfolk

A New and exciting shoot coming Jan 2026.





Sounds pretty normal so far right? Hold on to your quivers...

Day Two is team qualification and head to heads.

Ok, teams, a little different but not completely unusual... don't worry, we've got you covered, there's more excitement to come

## So... How will it work?

Day 1 and 2 timings.

Session 1, assembly 8.50am. Session 2, assembly 10.50am.

Head to Heads approx 1.30pm.

The shoot will run on timing, double alternating detail, **2mins** per end for qualifying, **90** seconds for **3** arrows for individual head to heads or **2** minutes for **6** arrows for team head to heads, and will be controlled by the referee team. All shooting will be at **18m**.

As this is not an official round, the AGB rules, much like the pirates code, are going to be considered more like guidelines...

So **team attire** is encouraged; jeans are allowed; no kit inspections (though standard bow rules will apply and the referees will keep an eye out for anything untoward); **27s** are allowed; and standard spacings are out the window so it's going to be cozy! Best make friends (or at least try not to make enemies) with those around you as it'll be **6 archers to a boss** (3 per detail). Don't worry, we have tested it and it works!

Communication (so cheering, heckling etc) with archers on the line is also encouraged...

Both days will use a version of a Vegas face for the qualifying round, but with a catch... ok, two catches... There will be **no 9's**, all the gold is a 10! Oh and they'll also be rotated 90°...

All entrants must be Members of Archery GB for insurance purposes.

Those entering Barebow/Longbow, or Juniors Under 18 years of age may shoot on a full 40cm face by request.

Teams must all use the same face type.

The qualification round will be **30 arrows** with **one** end of sighters.

Once you've set a qualification score, things get more interesting. Head to heads shall be carried out on Hit-Miss faces.

Hit-Miss happens a lot in Norfolk, how is this different we hear you ask...

Well, instead of just hit or miss, you can pick your target.

Hit the big spot you get **1 point**... but go for the smaller spot and you get **2 points**... miss and you get nothing.

Will you play it safe or will you go big! (Or possibly go home...)







On **day 1** you will compete within your bowstyle, there will be senior and junior (U18) categories but no gender distinction. Max capacity **84** archers.



For the Head to Head each archer has **3 arrows**. They can shoot either the **60mm** or the **40mm** spot with each arrow.

Archers will have **90 seconds to shoot 3 arrows**.

There shall be **3 ends** per match. Highest score wins. In the event of a tie it will be a sudden death **1 arrow shoot off**.

Entry will be £12 Senior, £10 Junior

**Day 2** teams are based on bowstyle with no separation based on age or gender, **anyone** can make up a team. Competition will be vs teams of the same bowstyle. Max **28** teams.

Head to Heads will follow the usual team format e.g. 1 on the line shooting, 2 behind the line. Each archer has **2 arrows**. They can shoot either the **60mm** or the **40mm** with each arrow. Referees will award yellow cards for foot faults or timing faults.

Teams have 2 minutes for all 6 arrows.

Each match will have **3 ends**. Highest score wins. In the event of a tie each archer in the team shoots **1 arrow**, the highest team score wins. If that is a tie, there is a **1 arrow shoot off**, where 1 archer is selected and shoots 1 arrow. If that is a tie, a different archer is selected and the same process occurs and so on until there is a winner.

Entry will be £30 per team.

There are **two** qualifying sessions per day. You only need to enter **one** qualifying round on each day. Archers/teams entering more than one session may have their second entry **refunded** to make space for those not already shooting

All archers/teams who shoot a qualifier will be put through to the head to heads, however, depending on total numbers some may not have a match. (le if there is one junior compound on day 1, or if there is only one longbow team on day 2 there obviously won't be a head to head match).

Awards will be made for each day of the shoot for the winners. As this is a new shoot the number of entries will directly affect the quality of **bling** we can acquire.

The shoot will take place at St. Walstans Hall on the Norfolk Showground.

Deb Horn will be the Head Referee.

Again, this is a new shoot concept. If you think it sounds like fun please support it. Equally if you spot any issues please do let us know, we have devised this from scratch.
